New Radiation Oncology CT Simulators

The Smilow Cancer Hospital Care Center in Guilford will soon boast a Philips Big Bore RT CT Scanner for radiation treatment planning. The Big Bore RT was first available in 2018 and allows for full visualization and positioning devices to accommodate all patients and increased accuracy in imaging and planning, and accelerated time to treatment. Increasingly precise treatment planning is available through enhanced accuracy in lesion identification, tissue density calculation, and segmentation. A second Big Bore RT is scheduled for installation in New Haven later this summer.

Screening at Entrances

At end of business day, Friday July 2, Yale New Haven Health will be ending COVID screening across the Health System in both inpatient and ambulatory settings. Starting July 3, we will no longer be taking temperatures at point of entry at any inpatient or ambulatory site. All patients and visitors must continue to stop, check in, and review symptom screening questions to receive a sticker/pass before entering the hospital.

Visitor Policy

As of Friday, June 25, all COVID negative adult inpatients are allowed to have two visitors per day. These visitors may come together or separately, with a maximum of two people visiting per day. Additional visitors are allowed for patients at immediate end of life or in other special circumstances. In addition, visitors in who are under 18 are now allowed accompanied by an adult.

Purple Team Update

Our purple team and their admitted patients returned back to main campus as of Monday, June 7th. The purple team continues to cover the busy hematology and oncology consult service at Saint Raphael Campus (average of 3 to 7 new consults a day and an active list of 12 to 20 patients). They will also continue to cover elective hematology and oncology admissions on the York Street Campus with APP support. The general rules of triaging day and night admissions to purple will stay the same with a cap of patients set at 5 for now. We will closely monitor the situation in the next weeks and months as the hospitalist program rolls out with a focus on improving the workload for all teams.


Emotional Wellness Webinars
