Dr. Price is Chief of the Health Inequities and Global Health (HIGH) Branch within the Center for Translation Research and Implementation Science (CTRIS) at the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI), National Institutes of Health (NIH). The HIGH Branch is the NHLBI’s main source for guidance pertaining to domestic and global health inequities implementation research and the focal point for advice and guidance on global health research and the study of implementation strategies for proven-effective interventions around the world. A proven leader with demonstrated success and results in challenging environments, Dr. Price provides vision and leadership to build transdisciplinary programs of research that create scientific opportunities to address challenging and persistent health problems in low resource settings within the U.S. and globally. Because of her more than 18-year career of servant leadership to the nation, with multiple publications to her credit, Dr. Price is considered an expert in the fields of public health, developmental science, and global health, and a highly sought speaker and colleague among her peers.

Dr. Price previously served as a Program Official and Deputy Director for Research in the Office for Research on Disparities and Global Mental Health at the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH). There she served as Project Scientist for a multi-million-dollar initiative involving eight distinct clinical trials designed to improve treatments and expand access to mental health care in more than 20 low- and middle-income countries. In addition, Dr. Price has held positions in academia at Research I institutions and a Historically Black University, and in the corporate world.

Dr. Price is a graduate of the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics, the nation’s first public residential high school for science, technology, engineering, and math. After receiving her B.A. degree in Psychology with Honors from Wake Forest University, Dr. Price attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where she earned her M.A. and Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology.
