**Abstract:** In this talk, we will hear about implementation science studies in LMICs from Latin America and other regions, with emphasis on theories, models and frameworks that have been used in different contexts, cross-cultural adaptations and lessons learned. Open methodological questions and knowledge gaps in implementation science will also be posted for discussion.

**Bio:** Dr Irazola is a cardiologist and epidemiologist. She is Director of the Institute for Clinical Effectiveness and Health Policy, and of the South American Center of Excellence for Cardiovascular Health, based in Argentina. Her research is focused on implementation science in the area of public health, health promotion, and prevention and management of chronic diseases. She has been involved in the design and evaluation of community-based and primary care programs and interventions related to CVD, diabetes and aging.

Dr Irazola is the Deputy Director of the Master's Degree Program in Clinical Effectiveness at the University of Buenos Aires, where she also teaches Advanced Epidemiologic and Analytical Methods. She is Associate Professor at the Cross-Continental MPH, [College of Global Public Health, New York University, and scholar and lecturer at the School of Public Health, Harvard University.](#)
