

Public Health Fellowship Program Agency Field Placement Proposal

The Public Health Fellowship Program (PHFP) aims to build interest in Connecticut public health careers and enhance practice-based learning experiences by financially supporting 3rd or 4th year undergraduates or graduate level students in high quality public health field placements. The program is funded by the CT Department of Public Health (CT DPH) Office of Public Health Workforce Development and administered by the Office of Public Health Practice (OPHP) at the Yale School of Public Health. Stipends of \$3,500 are paid directly to the fellows by Yale University. Fellows must work a minimum of 200 hours on their field placement.

The program aims to provide fellows a meaningful public health practice experience that:

- inspires them to work in a public health profession
- increases their knowledge of health equity
- improves their proficiency of selected public health practice competencies

Field placements should expose fellows to a variety of practice experiences and a range of learning opportunities. A qualified preceptor (supervisor) and alternate preceptor are required. The Public Health Fellowship Program is committed to increasing the diversity and inclusion of the public health profession, so the workforce is more representative of the

Agency Responsibilities

Agencies participating in the Public Health Fellowship Program have the following responsibilities.

- Assure a qualified preceptor or alternate preceptor will supervise the fellow during their field placement.
- Assure ongoing and consistent communication between fellow and preceptor.
- Collaborate with preceptor to identify a range of learning opportunities for fellow.
- Collaborate with preceptor regarding the amount and type of supervision to be provided.
- Assure students have been informed about agency policies and programs, including **HIPAA** confidentiality requirements.
- Support the preceptor and provide needed resources to accommodate the fellow.

Preceptor Information

A Preceptor serves as a day-to-day supervisor, mentor and role model for a PHFP fellow. The Preceptor must be willing to commit time to guide the learning experience of the fellow, provide ongoing feedback to the fellow on their work and participate in the Public Health Fellowship Program evaluation. An alternate preceptor should be identified

in the event the preceptor is not available due to work or personal obligations.

A preceptor must:

- Be employed by the agency and have a public health related advanced degree and > 2 more years of experience in public health, or >5 years of public health experience (in Connecticut preferred)
- Provide the Fellow with an orientation to the host agency, including the safety considerations, policies, and procedures within which the student is to operate.
- Model professional practice and conduct.
- Identify a range of learning opportunities for the fellow and provide the fellow with exposure to a variety of practice experiences within the agency or community.
- Arrange regular meetings with the fellow, provide constructive professional feedback, and be available as
 needed including providing coordination of any additional persons who will work with the student.
- Clarifying the explicit and implicit working norms of the field placement role and host agency norms.
- Maintain open communication with PHFP staff and notify the PHFP of any issues with the fellowship placement and engage in solution seeking efforts.
