Bryan Kutner, PhD, MPH is a health behavior psychologist at the HIV Center for Clinical and Behavioral Studies at the New York Psychiatric Institute and Columbia University. Dr. Kutner studies HIV-related stigma, specifically ways to lessen the deterrent effects of stigma before and during healthcare visits. His primary interest is in identifying and evaluating techniques to improve healthcare engagement. Over two decades, he has worked on educational programs for frontline HIV and harm reduction workers, including in the United States, China, the Caribbean, and sub-Saharan Africa.
