# NCI Research in the Era of COVID-19

The NCI, working with NIH, has implemented new flexibilities for the cancer research community during the COVID-19 pandemic to help to sustain progress in cancer research and to allow normal activities to resume promptly, when possible. In addition, they are increasing their focus on serology and cancer.

 <u>Flexibilities</u> include extending deadlines for applications, allowing institutions to use NCI grant funds for salaries and stipends, flexibly to extend project timelines and reporting requirements, and lengthening eligibility periods for early-stage investigators and trainees.

- NCI has just released a time sensitive <u>Request for Information (RFI)</u> seeking community input on research approaches and priorities related to SARS-CoV-2 serology and cancer. Responses to the notice are due by May 26, 2020.
- In addition, NCI posted a <u>Notice of Intent</u> to publish a FOA for components of the new Serological Sciences Network. The RFA is expected to be announced in June with expected application due dates in July.
