NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Radiation oncologists frequently encounter cancer patients with anxiety, depression, and insomnia and this grand rounds will improve their abilities to identify and treat these common psychiatric symptoms and disorders.

Sometimes, cancer patients will develop psychiatric symptoms that will require mental health referral and this grand rounds will help radiation oncologist recognize when referral should be made. In addition, radiation oncologists may not know where to refer their patients to and this grand rounds will discuss local resources.
