The purpose of this seminar is to highlight the persistent disparities faced by women with coronary heart disease, with a focus on acute myocardial infarction (AMI; heart attack). In doing so this talk will highlight key findings from the international VIRGO study (*Variation in Recovery: Role of Gender on Outcomes in Acute Myocardial Infarction patients*) which focuses on young women with AMI (18-55 years), a high-risk population known to experience poorer outcomes than similar aged men.
