Ambulatory Moves

This week, we will begin our first transition of ambulatory clinics back to Smilow in New Haven. NP 4 and NP 8 have been cleaned and are being prepared for our patients to return with a go-live on Monday, June 8.

- Breast Cancer, Prostate and Urologic Cancers, Endocrine Cancers, and Pain & Palliative Care will be located on NP 4. GI Surgery, Head and Neck Medical Oncology, Melanoma, Neurosurgery, GynOnc, Apheresis and Ophthalmic Oncology will be on NP 8.
- Thoracic Oncology, GI Medical Oncology, Liver Cancer, and Neuro-Oncology will remain in North Haven and Head and Neck Surgery will remain in Trumbull at this time.
- Due to the limited amount of space, please be mindful of social distancing while in our clinic areas.
- 2 patients will be scheduled per hour, per clinician between the hours of 7:30am-5pm; patients can also be scheduled through the noon hour. No double booking of appointments.
- Clinicians are encouraged to continue with 50% of their practice through Telehealth.
- It is strongly encouraged that patients have labs scheduled the day before an appointment to encourage timely appointments.
- In clinic, staff will be limited.

Interventional Oncology

In response to the COVID-19 crisis, the Interventional Oncology OR space in Smilow Cancer Hospital has been closed and the IO team has been providing care at Bridgeport Hospital over the past two months. As of last week, the Interventional Oncology Service has re-opened at Smilow for ambulatory patient care with safety precautions in place. Please call (203) 200-4747 for information.
