

Adam I. Rubin, MD is an Associate Professor of Dermatology, Pediatrics, and Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. There he directs the adult and pediatric nail clinics, and practices at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Rubin specializes in nail disorders, nail surgery, and histopathology of the nail unit. Dr. Rubin is the lead editor for the 4th edition of Scher and Daniel's Nails: Diagnosis, Therapy, Surgery, which is in press. He is an author of the 3rd edition of the Atlas and Synopsis of Lever's Histopathology of the Skin, and an associate editor of the 11th edition of Lever's Histopathology of the Skin. At the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia he is the pediatric dermatopathologist, and a member of the largest pediatric dermatology group in the United States. Dr. Rubin was awarded the 2018 University of Pennsylvania Department of Dermatology Bennett L Johnson, Jr. attending teaching award for dedication to teaching by the Penn dermatology residents. He is an Associate Editor for the Journal of Cutaneous Pathology, where he focuses on nail pathology and pediatric dermatopathology. He is an Assistant Editor for the journal Dermatologic Surgery, where he focuses on nail surgery. He serves on multiple other editorial boards including the Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology, The American Journal of Dermatopathology, and Skin Appendage Disorders. Dr. Rubin is a current board member of the Council for Nail Disorders, The European Nail Society, and the International Society for Dermatopathology. Dr. Rubin is the current Secretary-Treasurer of the Council for Nail Disorders. He is a co-director of the annual European Nail Society Nail Histopathology Workshop, which will be convening for the 3rd time in Paris in September 2018. Dr. Rubin is a graduate of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Columbia University, and completed his dermatology residency at Columbia University Medical Center in New York City. After residency, he completed a medical dermatology fellowship in Sydney, Australia with Professor Dedee Murell. He completed a two year dermatopathology fellowship at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, and joined the faculty there directly afterwards.
