Learning Objective:

Feedback is a critical component of mastery learning and a required activity of teaching faculty per undergraduate and graduate accrediting bodies. Faculty and trainee surveys locally and nationally reveal dissatisfaction in the feedback process. Strategies to support effective feedback and sociocultural changes that embrace psychological safety are needed to advance our effectiveness in feedback.

2. Compare evidence-based interventions to promote learning climate and psychological safety; and
3. Recognize behaviors and strategies she/he can deploy at all levels of the organization to promote psychological safety.
