GLOBAL IMPACT OF THE QUALITY OF CANCER SURVIVORSHIP CARE FRAMEWORK: PRESENT AND FUTURE

Needs:

Cancer survivorship is still an under-appreciated phase of cancer care. Systematic approach to evaluating the evidence and gaps in cancer survivorship is needed.

Objectives:

1. Describe the Quality of Cancer Survivorship Framework.
2. Provide examples of how the framework has been applied to-date.
3. Explore opportunities to use the framework to advance cancer survivorship care, research and policy.
