The lecture is entitled: **ETHNOGRAPHIC FILM: SHEDDING AN ANTHROPOLOGICAL LIGHT ON VIOLENCE, HEALING, AND RECOVERY**. This talk will consist of a brief overview of the field of ethnographic film followed by viewings and discussions of the discussants' work. Dr. Brandon Kohrt will present his film, *Returned: Child Soldiers of Nepal's Maoist Army*. This documentary tells the personal story of Nepali boys and girls as they attempt to rebuild their lives after fighting a Maoist revolution. Through the voices of former child soldiers, the film examines why these children joined the Maoists and explores the prevention of future recruitment. Jordan Sloshower will show his ethnographic depiction of how "citizenship" is being used as an innovative means of promoting recovery for New Haven citizens affected by mental illness, substance abuse, and criminal justice problems.
