The Center welcomes new trainees to fellowships each summer. Our training programs share a common goal of providing a deep understanding



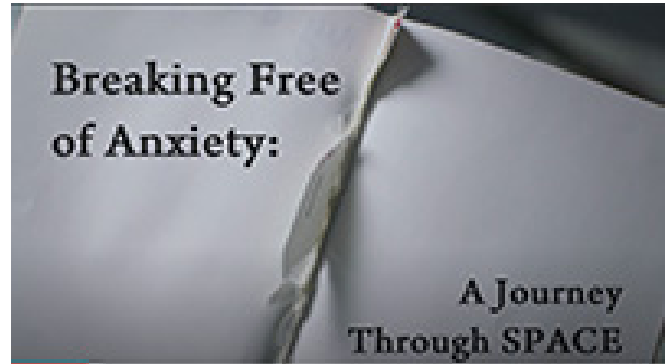
