### Meeting Theme: “The Art of Medicine”

New this year, the content of the regional meeting will reflect a theme, similar to the national meeting. This year the meeting theme will be “The Art of Medicine”, defined both as:

- The artful implementation of the science of medicine and/or medical education, and
- The role that medical journalism, creative writing, and other written, visual, and musical arts play in health care, healing, and medical education.

Meeting highlights include the following:

1. **Plenary Speaker:** H. Gilbert Welch, MD, MPH, Professor of Medicine at the Dartmouth Institute for Health Policy and Clinical Research and co-author of the book Overdiagnosed: Making People Sick in the Pursuit of Health (Beacon Press 2011).
2. **Writer’s Workshop:** Co-hosted by Yale faculty Anna Reisman, MD, co-editor of Telephone Medicine: A Guide for the Practicing Physician (ACP Press 2002) and Lisa Sanders, MD, Emmy Award winning broadcast journalist, New York Times columnist, medical advisor for the television show *House, M.D.*, and author of Every Patient Tells a Story: Medical Mysteries and the Art of Diagnosis (Broadway Books 2009).
3. **Faculty Development Track:** This workshop series will be co-sponsored by NE SGIM, Connecticut ACP, and residency program directors throughout the region. This special meeting track will train academic faculty in the principles of competency-based education and evaluation with a focus on milestones, entrustable professional activities (EPAs), narrative streams, and the Next Accreditation System (NAS). This will be a high-yield activity for residency program leaders, clinical competence committee members, and academic faculty.
4. **Networking and Career Mentoring:** Trainee-focused career development panels, Association of Chiefs and Leaders of General Internal Medicine (ACLGIM)-hosted faculty mentoring/leadership sessions, formal and informal mentoring opportunities.
5. **Entertainment:** Lunch-time music (Yale A Cappella), tour of the Yale “Brain Lab”, etc.

### MEETING CONTENT

The meeting will feature peer reviewed oral and poster presentations as well as workshops and symposia addressing a variety of topics relevant to the practice and teaching of general internal medicine, but this year with a special emphasis on topics reflecting the theme of the meeting.
