KEYNOTE SPEAKER Lisa Sanders, MD, Associate Professor of Medicine

Lisa Sanders is an internist on the faculty of Yale School of Medicine and teaches in the Internal Medicine residency program. She graduated from Yale Medical School and did her residency and chief residency at Yale's Internal Medicine Primary Care Residency Program. Sanders created and writes the biweekly Diagnosis column for the New York Times Magazine. Her column was the inspiration for the hit television series House MD, and she was a consultant for the show. Working with the New York Times and producer Scott Rudin, Sanders helped create a series of documentaries which followed patients in their search for a diagnosis using crowdsourcing. These documentaries are airing on Netflix. Her most recent book, Diagnosis: Solving the Most Baffling Medical Mysteries, a collection of her New York Times columns was published this summer. She also wrote the New York Times best seller, *Every Patient* Tells a Story: Medical Mysteries and the Art of Diagnosis. Before Sanders came to medical school, she was an Emmy award winning producer for CBS News.
