Updated Screening Guidelines

Smilow Cancer Hospital continues to update our screening guidelines to reflect the changing COVID-19 environment in Connecticut, and in our region.

- Patients are now asked if they have traveled out of state within the last 14 days. Per Connecticut guidelines, the following states are currently included in a travel advisory: Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Idaho, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Nevada, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Utah.
- If recently returning from travel, patients may be asked to change their appointment to a Telehealth visit or have their appointment rescheduled. The care team will review urgent clinical issues and determine the best plan of care.

Trainees

Starting the week of July 6, with the beginning of the new academic year, we look forward to welcoming trainees for whom participating in your Smilow clinics is critical (i.e. ACGME required) for their specialty training (for example, neuro-oncology fellows in neuro-oncology clinic), and non elective (e.g. internal medicine resident in breast medical oncology clinic).

There are several areas where workspace is at a premium, and maintaining social distancing is paramount. We will continue to monitor the situation, and we will contact you if the recommendations for our trainees change over the forthcoming weeks. Please note that visitors and medical students should not be returning to clinic at this time given social distancing constraints.
