Yale Pathways Research Internships (YPRI)

Fridays (7/1-8/16) | 9:30-11am & 11:30am-1pm

The [YPRI](#) program supports ~20 local public high school students in summer laboratory internships from July 1 - August 16. Students will be in the lab Monday-Thursday and will come together as a cohort on Fridays for small group mentoring and professional development workshops. We are in search of graduate students that want to be involved in the following ways:

Workshop Leader: Co-host a 90 minute interactive workshop (9:30-11:00am) with the support of YPRI staff to help students work towards their final presentations. Each Friday, a different presentation component will be covered (eg: introduction, background, results, etc.). Workshop leaders will be responsible for giving a 10 minute sample research presentation, leading a group discussion, and supporting students as they work on their own presentations in small groups.

Pod Leader: Pod leaders will be assigned to a group of 3-4 high school students. During Friday lunches (~11:30am-1:00pm), pod leaders will check in on student research experiences, address challenges students are facing to brainstorm ways to work through them, and be an integral part of helping students feel comfortable during their lab experiences.
