This October, *The Lancet* will release a new series: Advancing Early Childhood Development: From Science to Scale. The series reviews the latest evidence on child development and interventions; analyses what has been accomplished through investments in early childhood development; and looks at how successful programs can be scaled up to reach and support more families.

The launch of the Series takes place on **Wednesday 5th October 2016** in Washington DC, leading into to the World Bank Group's Human Capital Summit – *Investing in the Early Years for Growth and Productivity,* at their annual meeting of Finance Ministers.
