NEEDS ASSESSMENT:

Hypertensive Disorders of Pregnancy (HDP) are considered a ‘failed stress test’ and portends greater risk for future cardiovascular disease. Following pregnancy, little information is given to women about the condition, and there are no guidelines for supporting women in the months and years following HDP, resulting in missed opportunities for education, and prevention and control of cardiovascular risk factors.
