NEEDS ASSESSMENT

There is an important need for general internists to understand the value of community level primary care assessment for policy and health planning, and the advantages of community-based participatory research methods for studying health systems.

1. An overview of the gun control litigation scheduled to be heard by the Supreme Court this term, and the political tensions between the Senate and the Supreme Court that have emerged in the context of the case.
2. Insight into the 2000 court cases seeking health care relief from the opioid crisis and whether settlement money will go actually toward prevention or treatment.
3. The future for the ACA given recent decisions in the lower federal court and a case in the Supreme Court.
