Each of the 14 nurses and 7 APPs who rotate through the newly designed clinic volunteered to work in this high-risk area to take care of our patients. Beginning on April 3 under the direction of Tracy Carafeno, Nursing Director for Inpatient Care at Smilow and Lisa Barbarotta, Senior Manager of Practice and Education, they left the patients and staff they were comfortable seeing, and the locations they were used to working in, to create a dedicated Clinic for cancer patients. These staff quickly formed a team and developed expertise to safely test and triage patients with COVID-19 symptoms. Staffing a dedicated location to care for COVID-19 positive patients also minimizes staff and patient exposure to COVID-19 in our other Smilow locations. In just over a month, they have evaluated and triaged 136 patients. Their selfless dedication truly makes them Super Stars!
