#### **NEEDS ASSESSMENT**

The mental health field has predominantly focused on psychopathology and individually-based treatment approaches. Attention to the family has tended to be deficit-focused, skewed toward family dysfunction. There is a gap in knowledge and application of recent strengths-based multi-level approaches that engage families collaboratively for effective intervention. This presentation provides an overview of these advances and their application in training, practice, and research.
