Targeted Her2 Therapy and Her2 Testing in Endometrial Cancer: Current Status and Future Directions

Needs: Increasing clinical demand in pathology laboratories for HER2 testing of endometrial serous carcinoma; Lack of official endometrial cancer specific pathology Her2 testing guidelines

Objectives: Recognize unique features of Her2 protein expression and gene amplification in endometrial serous carcinoma; Compare Her2 testing guidelines between different tumor types (i.e. breast, gastric, and endometrial); Apply specific Her2 testing and scoring criteria for endometrial serous carcinoma
