NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Over the past decades, there are tremendous changes to the practice and treatment of Hodgkin and Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma. With the additions of Rituximab and newer immunotherapy options such as CAR T-cell therapy, the advancement of systemic therapy has led to impressive results and survival benefits. The changes in radiation fields, dosing, and indications additionally have led to less side effects with compromising disease control. Understanding how the field has evolved and where it is headed is crucial to being at the cutting edge of lymphoma treatment and providing evidenced based care to patients.
