Dung Phung, MD, PhD Visiting Scientist, Yale School of Public Health and Lecturer, School of Medicine, Griffith University, Australia

Title: "Climate Change and Health Impacts in the Developing Mekong Delta Region"

Dr. Dung Phung received his MD from Hanoi Medical University, his MPH in Occupational and Environmental Medicine from the University of Washington, and his PhD in Environment and Population Health from Griffith University, Australia. His recent research focuses on climate change and health in developing countries. The lower Mekong Delta Region (MDR), a tropical developing area, is considered one of the areas in South-East Asia most vulnerable to extreme hydro-meteorological events associated with climate change. Dr. Phung has conducted a series of studies on the health effects of high ambient temperatures, unusual and intensive flooding events, and sea level rise in the MDR. He is especially interested in translating complex scientific evidence into policies and practices to support climate change adaptation and mitigation strategies in this region.
