“I Can’t Remember Words: A 58 Year Old Gentleman with Mild Cognitive Impairment

NEEDS ASSESSMENT:

Cognitive impairment and dementia are common clinical entities. There is a need for physicians to recognize early signs of cognitive impairment and to be able to diagnose and appropriately refer patients for treatment. Families of patients with significant cognitive impairment assume caregiver burden that must also be recognized and addressed.
