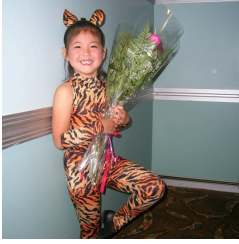
**Carlisle Topping** *as Peggy Bia, Dave Stitelman*

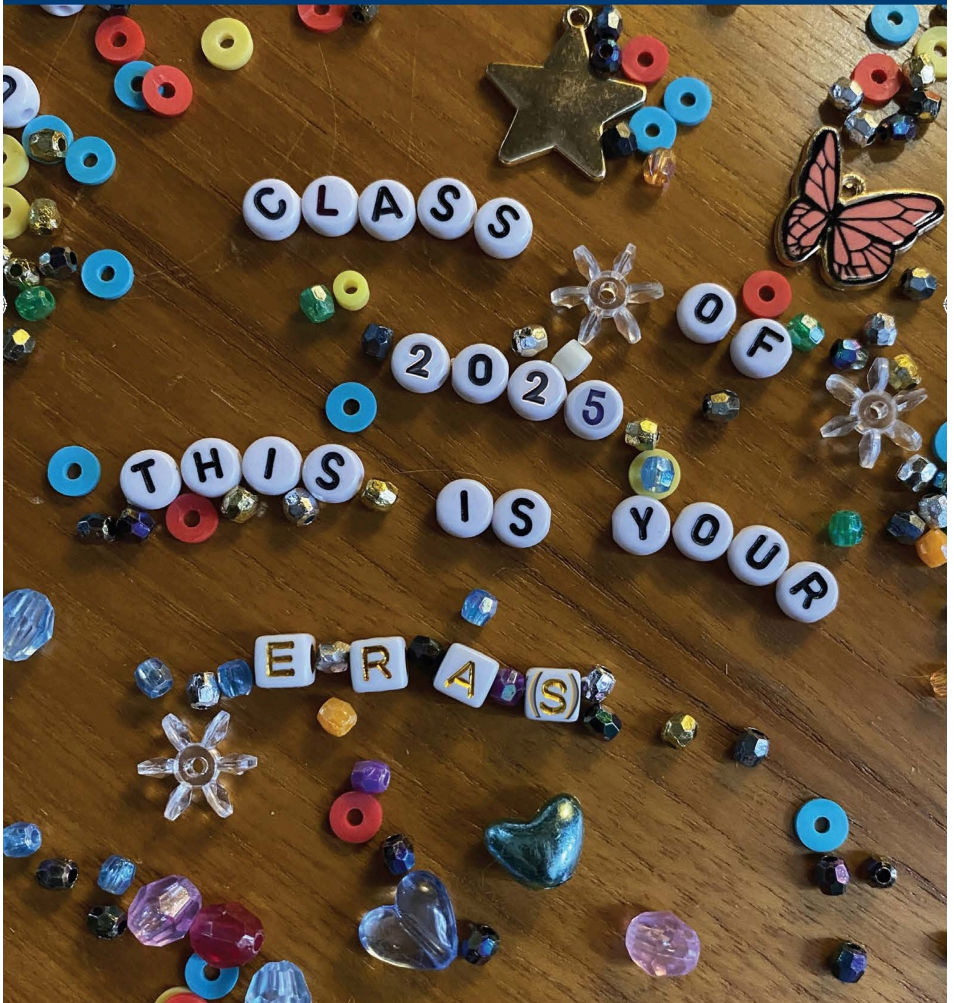

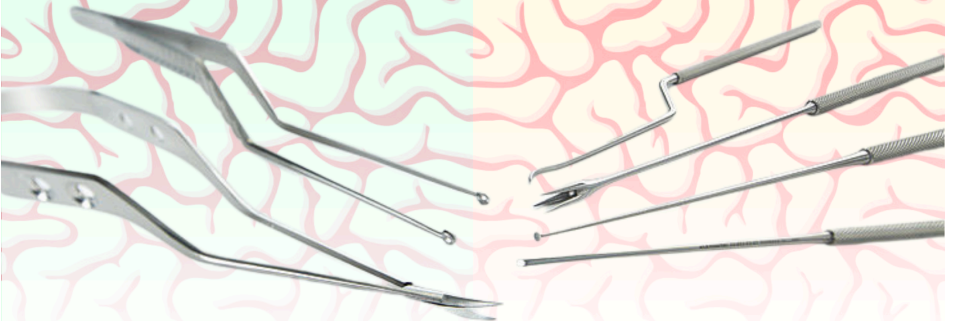

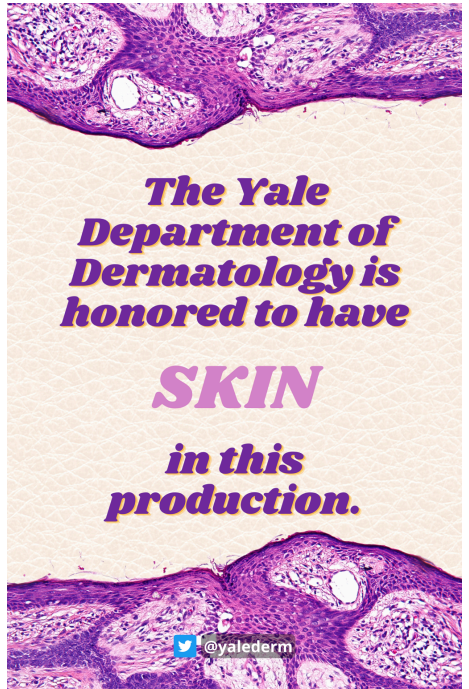
