Orange Care Center

Our Smilow Cancer Hospital Care Center in Orange will reopen on Monday, June 15 following an extended merger with our Care Center in Derby. Dr. Johanna LaSala and Dr. Kelsey Martin, along with their team of providers and caregivers will transition back to Orange, and all of their patient appointments will be rescheduled back to the facility. Thank you to the teams from both Derby and Orange for their patience, flexibility, and teamwork during the past three months.

Heart & Vascular Center - Interventional Radiology Services

- As an update to Monday's message, a successful program of interventional oncology services have been provided at YNHH throughout the COVID crisis. Up to 60 liver patients had therapeutic interventional procedures at a time when surgical options were limited.
- Ambulatory HVC IR services are expanding at our Park Avenue Medical Center post-COVID to 4 days/week.

Diagnostic Radiology

- As we restart our breast screening program, we are already imaging 5 times more women/week than we were in April.
- By adopting new post-COVID operational efficiencies, CT utilization at YNHH is now at 80% of pre-COVID levels, while still maintaining social distancing and a calm environment.
- Extended hours (evenings and weekends) are now available for breast and ultrasound imaging appointments.
