NEEDS ASSESSMENT:

Clinicians work in an increasingly complex medical environment with patients typically being cared for by a variety of specialists and primary team clinicians. There is a need for physicians who care for patients on the inpatient service to understand how to reconcile disparate information collected by various clinicians and to understand the impact of a patient's decision to leave the hospital against medical advice on their overall morbidity and mortality risk.

***To explore how disparate clinical information is reconciled in the context of a complicated, multidisciplinary inpatient environment.**

***To investigate the impact AMA discharge has on clinical outcomes.**
