

Needs: Developments in this field need to be disseminated to pathologists practicing different specialties for optimal patient care; Gaps in disease classification and precise diagnosis; Pathogenetic aspects are unique and provide a key framework for lymphomagenesis; Impacts on patient outcome.

Objectives: Improved disease recognition, appreciation of diagnostic criteria, and confirmation of diagnosis; Understand etiology and pathogenesis of these unique types of lymphoid proliferations; Prognostic and predictive factors.
