In October 2016, Healthy China 2030 (HC 2030) was presented as a national program of action to promote the health of 1.3 billion Chinese population. HC 2030 has since been central to the Chinese Government's agenda for health and development, and has the potential to benefit the rest of the world. This talk will summarize the roadmaps of recent health reform in China, make international comparisons, and discuss three major transitions regarding the HC 2030 blueprint.

## Xi Chen BIOGRAPHY

Xi Chen, Ph.D., is an assistant professor of Health Policy, of Global Health, of Economics, and of Faculty of Arts and Sciences at Yale University. He is a faculty fellow at the Yale Institution for Social and Policy Studies, the Yale Climate Change and Health Initiative, the Macmillan Center, the Yale Institute for Network Science, and the Yale-China Association. His research focuses on fetal and early childhood development, population aging and public policies, climate change and health, and quality of life.

Chen is a research fellow at the IZA Institute of Labor Economics, a fellow and cluster lead at the Global Labor Organization (GLO), President-Elect of the China Health Policy and Management Society (CHPAMS), a reviewer of the National Sciences Foundation (NSF), a visiting professor at Nanjing University, a commentator at CCTV America, and an alumni affiliate of Cornell Institute on Health Economics, Health Behaviors & Disparities. He has been consulting for multiple institutions in the United Nations. Chen's work has been funded by multiple grants through the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the Older American Independence Centers (OAICs), Natural Science Foundation of China (NSFC), and the Yale Macmillan Center. Chen's research has been recognized through numerous awards, such as the George Warren Award, the Outstanding Ph.D. Dissertation Award of the Agricultural and Applied Economics Association (AAEA), and the PEPPER Center Scholar Award. His research has been reported in major international media, such as The Economist, The Washington Post, The Times of London, The New York Times, and Time Magazine.
