
## **Grant Proposal Resources for Yale Pathology Graduate Students**



- Proposal Information Form (PIF): This document must be completed and sent to <a href="mailto:uma.raman@yale.edu">uma.raman@yale.edu</a> and <a href="mailto:path.research.affairs@yale.edu">path.research.affairs@yale.edu</a> before work on your budget can begin. The PIF requests information such as proposal title, key personnel, and funding opportunity to which you will be applying.
  - Please note: the information you provide can be changed, if necessary, during the proposal development process.
  - Uma Raman is Pathology's assigned Proposal Manager on the <u>Yale Pre-Award Team (YPAT)</u>. - Yale Required Compliance Training for New Principal Investigators (PIs): The following items must be completed before your application can be submitted:
  - o **COI Disclosures:** Current <u>conflict of interest disclosures</u> must be on file for all individuals identified in the Personnel Tab in PD as "responsible" *before* submitting an application.
  - Sponsored Projects Administration Training for Faculty (SPA): SPA is a mandatory requirement for all Yale PIs, multiple PIs and Co-PIs (this includes recipients of fellowships). The training requirement can be completed by accessing the <u>online self-assessment</u>.
  - Patent Policy Acknowledgement and Agreement (PPAA): The PPAA is a federal requirement and pertains to <u>all</u> Yale personnel. It is done once and can be <u>completed online</u>.
