Despite a lot of advances in their treatment modalities, management of these disorders is a challenge in resource settings and they remain a leading cause of maternal and neonatal mortality, and severe morbidity. This presentation highlights the experiences of managing these disorders in a busy tertiary African Hospital and potential areas of clinical and research collaboration. The ultimate goal is to create awareness about the burden of the hypertensive disorders in low resource settings with the intention of finding innovative ways of reducing their contribution to maternal and neonatal mortality and severe morbidity.
