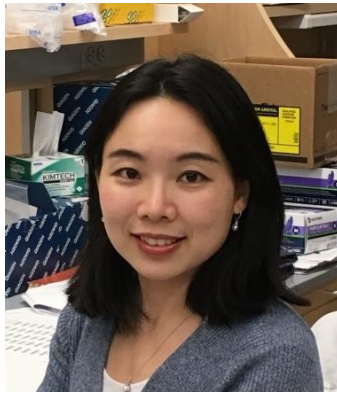

Bio:

Dr. Leyao Wang graduated from Fudan University with a Ph.D. degree in Molecular Virology and Immunology. She then received Master of Public Health training from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Dr. Wang has held postdoctoral appointments in the Johns Hopkins Medical Institute and Yale School of Public Health. Her research used population-based genomic analysis to reveal the underlying genetic determinants of pulmonary disorders, such as asthma. She has been exploring different epidemiological methodologies to incorporate environmental factors into genome study to more completely characterize the genetic architecture of asthma. Her current project focusing on rare variants associated with virus-related asthma has received NIH NRSA F32 individual fellowship award as funding support.
