"Tragedy of the commons: antibiotics and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease"

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is the fourth leading cause of death worldwide. COPD is characterized by intermittent acute exacerbations of disease (AECOPD) that are often caused by bacterial infection. Thus, antibiotics are commonly prescribed for treatment and prevention of AECOPD. We will discuss the use of antibiotics in COPD patients as a specific example of the clinical and public health challenges that arise in balancing the needs of individual patients and the public health imperative of reducing the injudicious use of antibiotics to combat the global threat of antibiotic resistance.
