We vow to respect all patients, including those who hold beliefs that contradict our own, be they religious, political, philosophical or otherwise. We will strive to earn the trust of our patients by providing confidential, capable, and compassionate care. We recognize that our patients will always be our greatest teachers.

We vow to leverage our privilege as physicians to advocate against laws and policies that discriminate against or compromise the health and well-being of our patients. We recognize that our patients' health extends beyond the exam room and is shaped by social, structural, and political inequities. We vow to address these injustices in our practice of medicine.

We vow to prioritize our own physical and mental health so that we may offer our best selves to our patients, loved ones, and communities.

We strive to always remember that the practice of our profession is a privilege and honor. We recognize the mentors who have taught and supported us and vow to do the same for others. We acknowledge the sacrifices made by those around us that have enabled us to pursue this profession.

With these words, we commit our work and lives to be stewards of Healing, vanguards of Justice, and torchbearers of Reason, on this day and for all days to come.
