

VA Medical Informatics Fellowship at VA Connecticut Healthcare System

The VA Medical Informatics Fellowship Program provides **two years** of post-residency / postdoctoral research and educational learning opportunities to board eligible or board-certified physicians and dentists and postdoctoral associated health professionals at competitively selected VA sites. Fellows spend their time in research and educational activities relevant to VA. Mentors of national stature provide guidance to fellows in rich learning environments. Graduates are expected to be role models in leading, developing, conducting, and evaluating innovative medical informatics programs.

Professors Cynthia Brandt, Amy Justice and Julie Womack are the directors of the fellowship program. The program is based at VA Connecticut Healthcare System and is closely affiliated with the NLM funded Biomedical Informatics and Data Science Training Program at Yale University.

Fellow Selection and Eligibility

Applicants should have a doctoral degree (e.g., an MD or PhD) in the clinical or biological sciences. Applicants should also have considerable computer programming experience and a desire to pursue a career based, in whole or in part, in Biomedical Informatics.



How to Apply

We ask all applicants to send us a **Curriculum Vitae**, along with a one or two page description of their computer experience and career objectives.

We also require **three** letters of reference.

Due to limitations imposed by our funding, applicants must be **U.S. citizens**. Applications from women and minorities are encouraged.
