Thank you to all our sites currently participating in our Next Day Access initiative. The chart above shows six months of data from July-December 2022. Next Day Access (NDA) attempts to offer appointments to see a breast surgeon and/or medical oncologist within one business day of referral. NDA slots are available for newly diagnosed patients, second opinions, and transfers of care. A pathology report is required and every attempt is made to get diagnostic imaging prior to the appointment. Operational Updates

Radiology Navigator

In January, a new radiology navigation workflow launched in New Haven. Our excellent team of radiology nurses have adapted the new workflow aimed at reducing care delivery gaps, improving our patients' experience, and reducing the time to treatment for our newly diagnosed patients. The new radiology nurse navigators will support each patient from biopsy through diagnosis and facilitate the handoff to treatment. After communication with the radiologist, the navigators notify patients of positive biopsy results and directly connect them


with our breast intake team. We are communicating the new workflow to our referring providers and are excited to offer this patient-centered navigation moving forward.


NP1 Move

After almost three years, the Smilow Breast Center on the York Street Campus has moved back to its original space on North Pavilion 1 (NP 1), Suite A. At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, the team temporarily moved to Guilford for three months and then back to New Haven to the North Pavilion 4 (NP 4) multidisciplinary clinic for two years so that the Smilow Rapid Evaluation Clinic (SREC) could evaluate and treat COVID positive patients on NP 1.

Senior leaders would like to thank the entire breast clinical team and nurse managers for collaborating with IT, operations, and EVS to ensure a smooth transition and seamless patient care. The clinic was packed up from NP 4 on Friday, January 6 after a full day of appointments and opened on NP 1 on Monday, January 9 without any interruptions in patient Care. Congratulations to the entire team!

Clinical Trials





Our clinicians and scientists focused on breast cancer have enthusiastically embraced translational medicine, including bringing the first FDA-approved immunotherapy for breast cancer to clinical trial.

Principal Investigator: Mariya Rozenblit, MD

ctDNA Trial: An observational study of circulating tumor DNA in triple negative breast cancers with residual disease after standard neoadjuvant treatment

In this observational trial, all treatment courses are at the discretion of treating oncologist as per standard of care. The study is available in New Haven, Trumbull, and Waterbury.

Key eligibility:

- Patients must have histologically confirmed ER-, PR-, and HER2- (TNBC). ER, PR, and HER2 negativity as per the 2018 joint ASCO/CAP guidelines.
- Patients must have residual invasive cancer less than 0.5cm in the breast or residual disease in an axillary lymph node after receiving neoadjuvant chemotherapy.
- Patients must have completed all intended neoadjuvant treatment for TNBC as per standard of care and must have completed surgical resection.
- Patients must be within 6 weeks of definitive surgery to be eligible for registration.
- 18 years of age or older; ECOG Performance Status < 4.

Care Center Highlight: Trumbull

Led by **Dr. Melanie Lynch**, comprehensive breast cancer care is provided to patients at our Smilow Cancer Hospital Care Centers in Trumbull and Fairfield, in collaboration with Bridgeport Hospital.

The Center has an outstanding multidisciplinary team of specialists to provide comprehensive care for patients, including breast radiologists, breast surgeons, medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, plastic surgeons, genetic counselors, social workers, advanced practice providers, and patient navigators. The breast surgery team includes **Dr. Melanie Lynch, Dr. Mehra Golshan,** and **Dr. Monica Valero**, who joined the team in the fall. **Dr. Melissa**

In radiation oncology, Dr. Shari Damast and Dr. Kevin Du specialize in breast cancer treatment. Dr. Kiran Sheikh and Dr. Laura Sheiman partner to provide breast imaging to patients.

The Breast Center in Trumbull offers patients genetic counseling, a dietitian, and Integrative Medicine, which includes massage, acupuncture, counseling, and support groups. Many patients are able to take advantage of these offerings at no cost to them.

The Breast Center has an amazing staff dedicated to providing the best possible care to patients. Advanced practice providers, **Jenna Addison** and **Karen Pollard Murphy**, provide expertise, specifically with high-risk and survivorship patients. In addition, **Pam Fitzgerald** and **Rachel Abraham**, both Oncology Certified Social Workers and recipients of the Bridgeport Hospital Quality Award as well as the Smilow Luminary Award, are invaluable to our patients and families. Nursing support in surgical oncology includes **Allison Vallance**, **Pat Poniros**, **Kendra Davis**, and **Leigh Berrien**. **Sally Cascella** serves patients as the survivorship coordinator and plans events to support the patients throughout the year.

The nurse coordinators within medical oncology, **Jeannie Jones**, **Allison Pitts**, and **Jade Silks** are instrumental in supporting the multidisciplinary clinics, providing supportive guidance during the onboarding process for new patients, and helping to support patients transitioning to medical oncology for treatment.
