NEEDS ASSESSMENT

COVID-19 presents unprecedented challenges for vaccination programs and policy, both for the approaching pandemic vaccination campaign as well as for routine vaccination. This talk will examine the real-time policy-making activities of federal, state, and local health officials in evaluating and deploying vaccines—particularly COVID-19 vaccines—and will equip providers to respond to questions from patients and families regarding the processes through which vaccine policies and recommendations are developed.
