Challenges in Management of Older Patients with Chronic Myeloid Leukemia (CML)

Needs: There is a need to understand the basics behind CML and if older patients should be managed differently, as well as how are they different from patients enrolled on clinical trials.

Objectives: Discuss the basics of CML including, epidemiology, basic biology, targeted therapy and operational cure, and molecular monitoring. Discuss the care of older patients with CML and if management should be different.



Dr. Podoltsev is an Associate Professor of Medicine (Hematology). He received his medical degree from Pavlov First State Medical University of St. Petersburg and completed a fellowship at Yale School of Medicine. He cares for patients with acute leukemias as well as myeloid neoplasms, and myeloproliferative neoplasms. He also provides care for patients with aplastic anemia and bone marrow failure syndromes and follows patients with clonal hematopoiesis of indeterminate potential (CHIP), and systemic mastocytosis and hypereosinophilic syndrome.

As part of the Yale COPPER Center, Dr. Podoltsev studies epidemiology, and the patterns of care and outcomes of patients with hematological malignancies. Dr. Podoltsev is a Principal Investigator for multiple clinical trials enrolling patients with acute leukemias and myeloid malignancies.
