Dr. Hilmer has broad translational expertise in geriatric pharmacology research assessing the relationship between medication use and geriatric syndromes including frailty, falls and cognitive impairment. Her basic pharmacology research includes studies of hepatic metabolism and drug hepatotoxicity in old age, effects of polypharmacy on frailty, effects of frailty on pharmacokinetics/ pharmacodynamics, and effects of anti-ageing interventions on frailty. She has written guidelines and policies to facilitate deprescribing and led the Australian ‘Recommendations for a National Strategic Action Plan to Reduce Inappropriate Polypharmacy’. She is best known for developing the Drug Burden Index (DBI), a pharmacologic measure of exposure to medications with anticholinergic and sedative effects. She and others internationally have published pharmaco-epidemiologic evaluations of DBI, she has evaluated DBI in a pre-clinical model, has conducted RCTs of DBI as a clinical decision support tool, and implementation studies are underway in Australia and internationally.
