Health 2035 – Converging with a Generation and DCP3 – The Disease Control Priorities Project, Third Edition with Prof. Dean Jamison

Please join us for a unique opportunity to meet with one of the most important actors in Global Health in the last three decades.

Prof. Dean Jamison will join Yale students from across the university to speak about the 2013 Lancet Commission – Health 2035, for which he was a lead author/commissioner. He will also speak about the Disease Control Priorities Project (DCP3), for which he is a lead investigator, as he was as on DCP2 and DCP1.

Prof. Jamison will highlight key issues in the outstanding agenda for Global Health and how they might be addressed as rapidly as possible and at least cost. He will also speak about the outstanding research agenda and the development of new tools for examining key Global Health issues, such as extended cost-benefit analysis. There will be considerable time, following Prof. Jamison's remarks, for questions and answers.

Prof. Jamison is a Professor Emeritus at the University of Washington. He has also held appointments at a number of other universities. Among many important contributions to the field of Global Health, Prof. Jamison was the lead author of the 1993 World Development Report, *Investing in Health*, which was a seminal piece in Global Health. He was also the lead author of the 1999 WHO World Health Report.

Prof. Jamison holds degrees from Stamford in Philosophy and Engineering and did his PhD in Economics at Harvard, with Prof. Kenneth Arrow, the Nobel Laureate in Economics.
