# Challenges of Diagnosis and Treatment of OSA in Pregnancy

Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA) is a common yet under recognized condition in pregnancy. The prevalence of OSA can be as high as 19%, one in five, pregnant patients yet few are evaluated and treated for this condition. The usual screening questionnaires for OSA have poor predictive value in pregnancy and providers are predominantly Obstetricians who may not know to look for it. Diagnosis and treatment of OSA in pregnancy is critically important as those who go untreated are at higher risk of hypertension, pre-eclampsia and gestational diabetes. This lecture will review the challenges in screening, diagnosis and treatment of OSA in pregnancy and highlight areas for improvement.
