Cultural Racism: Implications for Racial Inequities in Health

Dr. Cogburn's research focuses broadly on the role of racism in producing racial inequities in health. She is particularly interested in improving the characterization and measurement of racism; the health consequences of exposure to racism-related stress; and psychosocial processes that link racism-related stress, disease and disease processes. Her work also explores the potential of media and technology in eradicating racism and eliminating racial inequities in health. Dr. Cogburn is an assistant professor at the Columbia University School of Social Work and faculty of the Columbia Population Research Center. She is also a faculty affiliate with the Data Science Institute and Center on African American Politics and Society both at Columbia University.
