In the tradition of our predecessors, witnessed by our families, friends, and colleagues, whose sacrifices have made our journey possible, we make these pledges:

We pledge to dedicate our practice of medicine to the sick and vulnerable, fully committing to the principle that all humans deserve care. We honor the trust our patients place in us, striving always to provide empathetic, patient-centered, and humanistic care

We pledge to treat each patient with dignity and compassion, regardless of their identities, backgrounds, or beliefs – even when they differ from our own. We vow to honor the rights of all to receive care, regardless of the social or political climate at the time

We pledge to use our privilege as physicians to advocate for patients, especially the most vulnerable. We will recognize and challenge historical injustices and systemic inequities that perpetuate harm, ensuring that our practice of medicine does not repeat or reinforce past wrongs.

We pledge to honor those who came before us, from the generations of healers and scientists, as well as the patients and research participants whose sacrifices laid the foundation of our profession. We will steward medicine for those who follow, committing to lifelong learning, teaching, and mentorship.

We pledge to respect the scientific process and embrace medicine as an art and a discipline guided by evidence. We will acknowledge our limitations, seek guidance when uncertain, and remain steadfast in our commitment to intellectual humility and growth.

We pledge to remain true to our patients, striving to center their perspectives and understand their wishes while balancing our professional judgment and ethical duties. We will listen first and counsel second—curing sometimes, relieving often, and comforting always.

We pledge not to let personal gain or external pressures sway our judgment of what is best for our patients. We recognize that true healing extends beyond medicine and into the social, economic, and political structures that shape health.

Finally, we pledge to care for ourselves and our peers, recognizing that we cannot fully tend to the well-being of our patients without tending to our own.

With this oath, we bind ourselves to each other and to the practice of medicine, as stewards of Healing, vanguards of Justice, and torchbearers of Reason—on this day and for all days to come.
