NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Home noninvasive ventilation is associated with improved outcomes in acute exacerbations of COPD and in COPD-OSA overlap syndrome but benefit in chronic hypercapnic COPD has been more difficult to demonstrate. Recent work suggests that benefit is seen with NIV strategy targeted to reduce PaCO2. Challenges remain but recent ERS and ATS guidelines may inform decision-making.
